How to Make Treating Denture Patients Fun Again While Adding Revenue to Your Practice with Narrow Diameter Overdenture Implants

Participants will attend a 4 hour course which encompasses an evidence based lecture presenting background, theory, treatment planning, surgical and prosthetic procedures, and marketing of narrow- diameter overdenture implants. Emphasis will be placed on managing difficult denture patients and using minimally invasive surgical techniques to convert dentures to overdentures. Immediate Loading in Implant Dentistry: From the Biology to the Clinical of Basic and Advanced Situations

Immediate loading has been accepted as an evidence-based concept especially in the anterior part of the mandible and in areas with special anatomical and clinical requirements. This presentation will focus on the biology and especially on the criteria for success using immediate functional concepts of implants placed in poor bone qualities and compromised bone metabolism. The main characteristics of the implant design, implant/abutment connection, as well as considerations for a successful treatment will be presented. Long-term data using various concepts of perio-prosthetic treatment according to the histological evaluation demonstrate the evidence of such treatment protocols also in advanced clinical scenarios.

Practical Soft Tissue Handling Techniques in Implant Dentistry

Soft tissue around dental implants is essential in sculpting the ideal cosmetic appearance of the implant restoration. However, soft tissue plays a much more important functional role than the mere appearance - it is critical for the long term maintenance, as a reservoir of blood supply and a bed for the immune system, as well as providing specialized characteristics such as keratinized mucosa. This hands-on practical session will be focused on understanding the contemporary methods of creating and maintaining soft tissue form and volume. Didactic review of surgical and restorative techniques will be presented together with a hands-on workshop using pig jaws and other models. The current status of autologous biological enhancers including platelet-rich fibrin (PRF), concentrated growth factors (CGF), as well as enamel matrix derivative, and a number of soft tissue allografts and xenografts will be discussed. Innovative surgical techniques, use of gadgets, suturing techniques, and the role of implant design will also be covered.

- Understand indications for epithelial graft and sub-epithelial connective tissue graft and fundamentals of successful allogeneic tissue usage

Standard of Care in Dental Implant Treatment Planning, Record Keeping, and Informed Consent

Proper record keeping and informed consent are critical elements of any dental implant treatment. In today's litigious environment and strict regulatory (domestic and international) guidelines, not following and especially recording mandated treatment steps can have serious consequences. Implant dentistry involves high cost and high medical risks making it a perfect target for litigious patients and lawyers when things may not go perfectly.

A dentist's best defense in any complaint are comprehensive detailed records. The dental implant provider (both surgical and prosthetic) must follow specific protocols that meet the requirements of informed consent by the patient. In addition records must show that the provider planned, followed and especially recorded all steps involved in providing treatment that meets the standard of care.

This presentation will first show the attendees a step by step method of how to present a dental implant treatment plan that will increase case acceptance and provide proper informed consent. Then it will show how to comprehensively plan and record a dental implant treatment plan. Finally, it will show how to document the treatment itself to meet the standard of care.

Socket Grafting for Implant Placement

The success of a dental implant depends largely on the quality and quantity of bone at the time of placement. Grafting a socket at the time of extraction can facilitate the implant placement and in many situations save time and money for the patient by eliminating more involved grafts at a later date. This lecture will review a classification of sockets with a decision tree of techniques to graft based on the anatomy of the remaining socket. Consideration will also be taken to preserve and create an adequate zone of keratinized tissue. This course will include a hands-on portion in the order the practice techniques are discussed.
