Immediate Implant Placement in the Esthetic Zone: Optimizing Soft Tissue Outcomes Conservatively

The improvement of implant design has enabled us to place immediate implants and a provisional restoration predictably when treatment is done in the esthetic zone. Avoiding Complications in the Treatment of the Posterior Maxilla

Implant treatment involving the edentulous posterior maxilla often presents a significant challenge due to inadequate bone quantity and quality. Treatment options will be discussed to increase success rates and decrease morbidity. Complications involving "closed" vs. "open" augmentation procedures will be reviewed including post-operative infections, bone loss, and implant failure. A pharmacologic regimen will be discussed of the treatment of preoperative sinus disease and post-operative infections.

Socket Grafting for Implant Placement

The success of a dental implant depends largely on the quality and quantity of bone at the time of placement. Grafting a socket at the time of extraction can facilitate the implant placement and in many situations save time and money for the patient by eliminating more involved grafts at a later date. This lecture will review a classification of sockets with a decision tree of techniques to graft based on the anatomy of the remaining socket. Consideration will also be taken to preserve and create an adequate zone of keratinized tissue. This course will include a hands-on portion in the order the practice techniques are discussed.
