Bone Density Workshop: Achieving Initial Stability in Compromised Sites

This course will demonstrate how altering surgical protocols can increase implant success rates in varying bone densities. A detailed surgical and prosthetic protocol will be described, with emphasis on poor bone density sites. Participants will insert implants into bone blocks of different densities to experience the results of optimizing surgical protocols. Use of a resonance frequency device for determining implant stability will be demonstrated and used by participants.

Extraction Socket Grafting for Implant Site Development

The long term success of dental implants is often dependent on the quality and quantity of bone available for implant placement. Extraction socket grafting is a crucial step in implant site development and often reduces the need for additional bone grafting procedures. This course will review the step by step procedure for predictable extraction socket grafting. Selection of the appropriate bone graft material and membrane will also be discussed. Zirconia Ceramic Implants: The Next Chapter in Dental Implantology

The last decade has seen a sharp increase in the use of zirconia in dental implantology and fixed prosthodontics. Various composites of zirconia have emerged both in orthopedics and dental implantology as highly biocompatible implantable bioceramics. Along with scientific research there has also been a rise in clinical reports of metal sensitivity and associated health problems as a result from the implantation of metals. The demand for metal free solutions for tooth replacement by patients has been on a steady rise during the last decade, therefore it is important that clinicians and their staff not only familiarize themselves with ceramic implants but also understand this material which is regarded as a highly biocompatible and as a viable metal free alternative for teeth replacement.

This workshop will consist of lectures, clinical case presentations and hands-on supported by clinical and scientific research reports will present how ceramic implants can successfully and predictably be used as a top-to-bottom metal-free option for teeth replacement. Case selection, treatment planning and case management will be presented.


